To Committee Chair, Representative Ken Rajhes, and Committee Members:

I am writing in opposition to the 30 x 30 Plan Biden's administration is attempting to implement.

The 30 x 30 plan goes against the very fabric of our nation and the premise of our US Constitution. We were designed to be a free nation and a free people – our inalienable right. The role of the government is to protect our constitution rights which means a right to personal ownership and property.

Our federal government has become a monster! <sup>10</sup> So Samuel told all the words of the LORD to the people who were asking for a king from him. <sup>11</sup> He said, "These will be the ways of the king who will reign over you: he will take your sons and appoint them to his chariots and to be his horsemen and to run before his chariots [draft them into wars]. And he will appoint for himself commanders of thousands and commanders of fifties, and some to plow his ground and to reap his harvest [enrich himself and govt. officials], and to make his implements of war and the equipment of his chariots. <sup>13</sup> He will take your daughters to be perfumers and cooks and bakers [and now recruit them to fight in our wars]. <sup>14</sup> He will take the best of your fields and vineyards and olive orchards and give them to his servants. <sup>15</sup> He will take the tenth of your grain and of your vineyards and give it to his officers and to his servants [our federal taxes far exceed this]. <sup>16</sup> He will take your male servants and female servants and the best of your young men<sup>[a]</sup> and your donkeys, and put them to his work. <sup>17</sup> He will take the tenth of your flocks, and you shall be his slaves. <sup>18</sup> And in that day you will cry out because of your king, whom you have chosen for yourselves, but the LORD will not answer you in that day."

- 1 Samuel 8:10-18

Unlike the Israelites, we are pleading that we do **NOT** want a king. We want government to become smaller and to represent us, not enslave us!

We need courageous leaders in our country that will hold the ground and stand against tyranny and for the rights of Kansas citizens.
