
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2025 by Representative Corbet

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2025 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2025 would prohibit a Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism law enforcement officer or a county weed supervisor to conduct surveillance on private property unless authorized by a warrant. The bill would also prohibit any Kansas law enforcement agency to enter into an agreement with an owner or operator of a utility pole to install a tracking device in order to conduct surveillance on private property unless authorized by a warrant.

The Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism, the Kansas Highway Patrol, and the League of Kansas Municipalities state that HB 2025 would have no fiscal effect. The Kansas Association of Counties states that it does not know if surveillance on private property is a widespread issue and therefore the fiscal effect is unknown.
