
**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2086 by House Committee on Education

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2086 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2086 would allow a pharmacist to distribute a stock supply of standard-dose and pediatric-dose epinephrine autoinjectors, albuterol metered-dose inhalers, albuterol solution and spacers to a school with an appropriate prescription. A physician or mid-level practitioner who writes a prescription for this medication or who provides training to school personnel would not be held liable for civil damages resulting from the administration of this medication.

The enactment of HB 2086 would have no fiscal effect. The Board of Healing Arts notes that the enactment of the bill may result in additional complaints to the Board, which may require additional investigations; however, the number of complaints is likely to be negligible.
