
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2140 by Representative Highberger, et al.

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2140 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Under current law, an individual may carry a concealed handgun in the state capitol if they have a license. HB 2140 would no longer allow an individual to carry a concealed handgun in the state capitol, except that an individual may possess a handgun in any structure connected to the state capitol or any area designated for parking motor vehicles. The bill would not apply to certain individuals described in the bill.

The Kansas Highway Patrol and the Office of the Attorney General state that enactment of this bill would have no fiscal effect.
