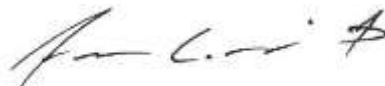
**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2192 by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2192 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2192 would permit community corrections agencies in Kansas to issue an identification certificate to an offender under probation supervision for the purposes of the offender obtaining a replacement driver's license.

The Office of Judicial Administration indicates that enactment of the bill would require court services officers to complete a form for their probationers, which would require additional staff time. However, the fiscal effect would be negligible. The Department of Corrections and the Department of Revenue indicate enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect on the agencies. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2192 is not reflected in *The FY 2022 Governor's Budget Report*.
