
**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2262 by House Committee on Health and Human Services

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2262 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2262 would remove the requirement to provide a completed and executed coroner's permit to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) to cremate a dead human body under certain circumstances. Also, the bill would authorize electronic permits to cremate dead human bodies and would eliminate certain monthly funeral director reporting requirements to KDHE.

KDHE and the Board of Mortuary Arts indicate the enactment of HB 2262 would have no fiscal effect.
