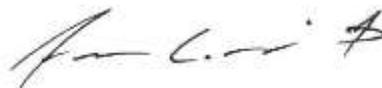
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2629 by House Committee on Transportation

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2629 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2629 would remove mandatory jail time for a habitual violator convicted of driving while their driver's license is canceled, suspended, or revoked.

According to the Office of Judicial Administration, enactment of the bill would have a negligible fiscal effect on Judicial Branch operations.
