AN ACT concerning law enforcement officers; relating to the Kansas law
enforcement training act; requiring newly certified officers to attend
diversity meetings.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. (a) Every police officer or law enforcement officer who is 7 issued a certification by the commission pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5607a, and 8 amendments thereto, on or after January 1, 2022, shall attend one diversity 9 meeting within six months after such certification is issued. Verification of 10 attendance at such meeting shall be completed by each officer and 11 submitted to the commission in such form and manner as prescribed by the 12 commission.

13 (b) The commission shall schedule not fewer than two diversity meetings each year. Each meeting shall be open to any police officer or 14 law enforcement officer who was issued a certification pursuant to K.S.A. 15 16 74-5607a, and amendments thereto, during the immediately preceding six months. For each diversity meeting, the commission shall invite prominent 17 18 members of minority communities who are selected from a list of 19 individuals whose names are provided to the commission pursuant to 20 subsection (c). The commission also may invite any other individuals, 21 including members of the general public, to attend a diversity meeting.

(c) The Kansas human rights commission shall provide the commission a list of individuals who are prominent members of minority communities across the state. The Kansas human rights commission shall review the list at least once each year and may update the list whenever necessary.

(d) On or before January 1, 2022, the commission shall adopt rulesand regulations to implement the provisions of this section.

(e) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to the Kansas lawenforcement training act.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the statute book.
