Voting gives people like me some say about how government runs things or at least the appearance thereof. As a growing faction of the population in our country are feeling less confident in our elections and their outcomes, I find it breathtaking a bill like this has been brought forward. In an Ad Council Research Institute study released last year it found 66% of Conservatives and 46% of Independent voters lack confidence in elections.
