RE: HB2150- Repealing the city planning authority 3-mile zone beyond city boundaries

Chairman Bergquist, Vice Chair Blex, Ranking Member Featherston and Members of the committee,

It is in the interest of the citizens that we serve to recognize their innate rights, not least of which is property ownership. While it's important to create regulations and rules that we must adhere to, so that we do not infringe on the rights of each other, there are situations that we have created that serve less purpose and cause indiscriminate harm to the individual sovereignty within society that we each are given by our Creator.

Practically speaking, the current growth of the urban sprawl, especially around larger population centers in Kansas, brings this issue to greater importance.
