Chairman Baumgardner and members of the Senate Education Committee, thank you for the opportunity to share my thoughts on this bill.

This bill prohibits students from being forced to share a bed in a mixed gender group on a school overnight activity. It seems odd to have to even point out that forcing male and female students into the same bed is not only ludicrous, it is evil. The only thing worse than a teacher or adult supervisor thinking this kind of activity was appropriate would be a legislator thinking it was acceptable. I have four children, the oldest is 23 and the youngest is 15. We have homeschooled for the last 12 years because of the direction that I felt the school was going even 12 years ago. I have to complete a Child Protection Survey every year for my tutoring position through Protect My Ministry. These teachers and adults who are authorizing this qualify for arrest based on the training I took. This is sexual deviancy gone mainstream.

When you see a baby, especially your own, you can stare at it for so long. They are mesmerizing, especially if they are looking back at you. It is a singular phenomenon. I think the quality that literally almost absorbs us is innocence. A baby, unlike anyone else, is innocent. Jesus was sinless, too. Jesus's blood cleanses us and makes us completely innocent. God can look on Jesus, and us by extension, with that same kind of complete love we experience when we look at a (our) baby. This is what the schools apparently want to destroy. Innocence is the enemy as far as the devil is concerned, so the earlier the better. We deserve judgement. I think it is coming down the pike.
