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Section 1. K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 65-6111 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-6111. (a) The emergency medical services board shall:

- Adopt any rules and regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this act;
- review and approve the allocation and expenditure of moneys appropriated for emergency medical services;
- officers and sponsoring organizations; conduct hearings for all regulatory matters concerning ambulance services, emergency medical service providers, instructor-coordinators, training
- (4) submit a budget to the legislature for the operation of the board
- (5) develop a state plan for the delivery of emergency medical services;
- enter into contracts as may be necessary to carry out the duties and functions of the board under this act;
- the executive director; review and approve all requests for state and federal funding involving emergency medical services projects in the state or delegate such duties to
- (8) approve all training programs for emergency medical service providers and instructor-coordinators and prescribe certification application fees by
- fees by rules and regulations; approve methods of examination for certification of emergency medical service providers and instructor-coordinators and prescribe examination
