SENATE BILL No. 131

By Senators Pittman, Doll and Erickson

AN ACT concerning certain healthcare providers; relating to the powers, duties and functions thereof; providing an exemption from licensure requirements for certain out-of-state physicians practicing medicine on a limited basis in the state during certain sporting events; authorizing the state board of healing arts to adopt rules and regulations related thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

(1) The physician has a written or oral agreement with a sports team to provide medical care to team members and coaching staff traveling with the team for a specific sporting event to take place in this state; or

(2) (A) the physician has been invited by a national sport governing body to provide medical services to team members and coaching staff at a national sport training center in this state; or

(B) to provide medical services at an event or competition in this state that is sanctioned by a national sport governing body.

(b) The physician's practice of medicine shall be limited to that required by the national sport governing body and such medical services provided by the physician shall be limited to those within the physician's board certification.

(c) Nothing in this act shall be construed to permit a physician exempt from state licensure requirements by the provisions of this act to:

(1) Provide medical care or consultation to any individual residing in this state, other than individuals described in subsection (a); or

(2) practice medicine at a licensed healthcare facility in this state.

(d) A licensure exemption obtained pursuant to the provisions of subsection (a)(1) shall be valid while the physician is traveling with the sports team, except that no exemption shall be granted for longer than 10 days in duration for each respective sporting event. A maximum of 20 additional days per sporting event may be granted upon request made prior to the sporting event to the state board of healing arts, except that no

an out-of-state physician holding a license issued by the applicable licensing agency of another state may practice medicine on a limited basis in this state during certain sporting events, if such physician receives a sports waiver issued by the state board of healing arts. The board shall issue such a waiver within 15 days from receipt of a complete application if the physician:

(1) Submits a complete application in a manner determined by the board;

- (2) holds an unrestricted license to practice medicine and surgery in another state and is not the subject of any investigation or disciplinary action by any applicable licensing agency; and
- (3) has professional liability coverage for the duration of the sporting event that meets the minimum level of coverage required to practice in Kansas; and
- (4) meets at least one of the following qualifications:

(A)

Any person practicing under a sports waiver issued by the state board of healing arts

(1) The scope of practice defined by Kansas law for such healthcare profession; and (2) such healthcare services required under the written agreement either with a sports team for team members and coaching staff or healthcare services

Any person practicing on a sports waiver under the provisions of this section shall be subject to all rules and regulations pertaining to the practice of the licensed profession in this state and shall be considered a licensee for the purposes of the professional acts administered by the board

- (d) A sports waiver issued under this section shall be valid for the time certified by the healthcare professional or national sports governing body for each respective sporting event, except that no waiver shall be valid for longer than 30 days.
- (e) No individual shall be permitted to be issued more than five sports waivers in a calendar year, unless otherwise approved by the board for an extenuating, unforeseen circumstance.

- (e) A licensure exemption obtained pursuant to the provisions of subsection (a)(2) shall be valid during the time certified by the national sport governing body, except that no exemption shall be granted for longer than 30 days.
- (f) The state board of healing arts may enter into agreements with the medical and osteopathic licensing boards of other states to implement the provisions of this act. Agreements may include, but not be limited to, procedures for reporting potential medical license violations.
- (g) The state board of healing arts is hereby authorized to adopt rules and regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this section, including, but not limited to, procedures for reporting potential medical violations.
- (h) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to article 28 of chapter 65 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.

Any individual issued a sports waiver or out of state sports team shall report to the board any potential violation of the healing arts act or other applicable practice act, including but not limited to professional incompetence or unprofessional conduct.

- (g) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the board from denying an application for a sports waiver under this section if the board determines that the individual does not meet technical qualifications or that granting the application may endanger the health and safety of the public.

(2) Consistent with this section, the board may adopt procedures to allow other healthcare professionals licensed and regulated by the board to be issued a sports waiver to ensure patient safety.
