
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2247 by House Committee on Child Welfare and Foster Care

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2247 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2247 would prohibit all banks operating in Kansas from denying deposits without a cosigner from minors over age 16 if in the custody of the Secretary for Children and Families, a federal recognized Indian tribe in this state, or the Secretary of Corrections if deposited with the consent of the custodian. The minor would be responsible for banking costs or penalties associated with the deposits. The Secretary for Children and Families, their designee, or any foster or biological parent could not be held responsible for such costs or penalties.

The Kansas Department of Corrections, the Department for Children and Families, and the Office of the State Bank Commissioner indicate that HB 2247 would not have a fiscal effect on the agencies.
