# HOUSE BILL No. 2279

AN ACT concerning water; relating to groundwater management districts;
 requiring groundwater management districts to submit annual reports to
 the legislature; directing groundwater management districts to submit
 conservation and stabilization plans to the chief engineer; prohibiting
 groundwater management district board members from farming land
 owned by the district unless a request for proposal for farming such
 land is issued.

9 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

10 Section 1. (a) Not later than January-<u>31</u> 25 of each year, the board of each district shall submit to the house of representatives standing 11 committee on water, the house of representatives standing committee on 12 agriculture and natural resources, the senate standing committee on 13 14 agriculture and natural resources and any other appropriate committees, and any successor committees, a written report on the *budget*, finances and 15 16 activities of the district-in the calendar year most recently audited. Such 17 report shall contain a detailed financial statement and a description of the activities undertaken by the board and shall be prepared according to-18 19 generally accepted accounting principles in accordance with K.S.A. 75-20 1120a, and amendments thereto. If the most recently audited year is not 21 the previous calendar year, then a draft or unaudited report for the previous 22 ealendar year shall also be submitted. A representative of the board shall 23 appear before the committee upon request. 24 (b) The<u>financial statement included in the</u> annual report shall

25 include, but not be limited to:

26 (1) <u>An itemized list of all income and the source from which the</u>
 27 <u>income was received, including any grants and interest income carned;</u>

28 (2) an itemized list of all expenditures by the board; and

29 (3) an accounting of all assets currently held by the board.

30 (c) The annual report shall also include The most recent approved 31 audit prepared in accordance with K.S.A. 75-1120a, and amendments 32 thereto;

33 (2) an accounting of all assets currently held by the board;

34 (3) the budget adopted for the current year pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-

(4) a detailed description of the activities of the district; and

3 (5) a detailed statement that explains how the expenditures by the 4 board served to further the conservation **and reduced consumptive use** of 5 groundwater, the prevention of economic deterioration and the 6 stabilization of agriculture or otherwise supported implementation of the 7 district's management program.

8  $(\underline{d})(c)$  Beginning in January 2025, the report shall summarize the 9 action plans and activities undertaken pursuant to section 2, and 10 amendments thereto.

(d) Each year, each district shall publish the annual written report
 required by subsection (a) on the district's website.

13 (e) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to article 10 of 14 chapter 82a of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto.

(a) It is the intent of the legislature that the groundwater-15 Sec. 2. 16 resources of the state be conserved and extended by local water users for 17 the prevention of economic deterioration and stabilization of agriculture-18 pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1020, and amendments thereto. The legislature has 19 provided tools for districts and local water users to achieve such goals with 20 intensive groundwater use control areas designated pursuant to K.S.A. 21 82a-1036, and amendments thereto, and local enhanced management areas 22 established pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1041, and amendments thereto.

23 (b) (1) Not later than <u>July 1</u> December 31, 2024, the board of each district shall identify all priority areas of concern within each such 24 board's district and set reasonable boundaries for each area of concern 25 using data from the Kansas geological survey or any other source 26 approved by the chief engineer. Subject to the approval of the chief 27 engineer, the board of each district may request an extension of up to 28 29 six months to identify such priority areas of concern upon good cause shown and upon any terms or conditions required by the chief 30 31 engineer. Priority areas of concern include, but are not limited to, areas 32 where.

(A) The estimated usable lifetime of groundwater is 50 years or
 less or similar aquifer conditions exist as evidenced by water level
 decline and water use data provided by the Kansas geological survey; or

36 (B) an unreasonable deterioration of the quality of groundwater

### (2) Priority areas of concern may also include areas where:

(A) Groundwater levels are declining or have declined excessively;

40 (B) the rate of withdrawal of groundwater equals or exceeds the rate 41 of recharge;

(C) preventable waste of water is occurring or may occur; or

43 (D) an unreasonable deterioration of the quality of groundwater-is-

1 occurring or may occur; or

## 2 (E) other areas identified by the board of a district and approved 3 by the chief engineer.

4 (3) After the board of each district identifies priority areas of concern, 5 the board shall submit a report to the chief engineer detailing the priority 6 areas of concern, the nature of such concern and how the areas were 7 identified and developed.

8 (2)(4) (A) The board of each district shall conduct public education 9 and outreach in each **priority** area so that the board may develop an action 10 plan to reasonably address the identified concerns in each area based on input from the water right owners and users within the area-that will-11 support conservation, the prevention of economic deterioration and the-12 stabilization of agriculture, based on the information available. Such action 13 plan shall be incorporated into the district's management program and 14 15 submitted to the chief engineer by July 1, 2026.

16 (B) Within 90 calendar days after a district submits an action plan, or any subsequent updates to such action plans as described in 17 18 subparagraph (C), to the chief engineer, the chief engineer shall review 19 such district's action plan and identified priority areas of concern. If 20 such plan-is and priority areas are approved by the chief engineer, the 21 chief engineer shall implement any action plan that requires action from 22 the chief engineer. Once a district's action plan has been approved by the 23 chief engineer, the board of each district shall implement the action plan as 24 soon as practicable and incorporate the action plan and priority areas 25 into the district's management program at the next annual review.

(C) Each action plan required by this section shall be reviewed every
five years at the same time and in the same manner that the board reviews
its management program pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1029, and amendments
thereto. Following such review, the board shall either reaffirm the action
plan or propose that it be revised. If the board proposes to revise an action
plan, then the board shall follow the same procedure towards adoption of a
revised action plan as described in this section for an original action plan

At least every five years, the board of each district shall review<u>the</u> existing priority areas of concern, any action plans previously adopted and the district at large to identify any new areas that meet the priority area conditions. Upon such review, the board shall update its *priority areas of concern and* action plan as necessary and shall submit such findings and any updates to the chief engineer.

39 (e)(b) If a board fails to identify priority areas of concern within a
40 district or to submit a management program that includes a an action plan
41 to address the concerns in each area identified, or subsequent updates to
42 such action plans, or if a board submits a plan that fails to adequately
43 reasonably address the problems within each area identified, the chief

2 (1) Designate priority areas of concern in accordance with 3 subsection (a);

(2) create an action plan in accordance with subsection (a); and

5 (3) take such corrective actions necessary under the authority 6 granted to the chief engineer pursuant to the Kansas water appropriations 7 act and Kansas groundwater management act to carry out the action 8 plan.

9 (d)(c) Upon request of a board, the chief engineer shall review the activities previously undertaken by the board to determine if the board has 10 already complied with some or all of the requirements of this section. All 11 12 areas within a district that have adopted a local enhanced management area-established pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1041, and amendments 13 thereto, on July 1, 2023, shall be considered to be a priority area of 14 15 concern with an approved action plan in compliance with the 16 requirements of this section subsections (a)(1) and (a)(4)(B) until the 17 first action plan review pursuant to subsection (a)(4)(C). All areas within a district that have an established intensive groundwater use 18 19 control area established pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1036, and amendments 20 thereto, on July 1, 2023, shall be considered to be a priority area of 21 concern with an approved action plan in compliance with the 22 requirements of subsections (a)(1) and (a)(4)(B) until reviewed by the chief engineer pursuant to a schedule established in rules and 23 24 regulations.

25 (e)(d) The Kansas department of agriculture, including the division of water resources and the division of conservation, chief engineer, Kansas 26 water office, Kansas department of health and environment, state 27 28 corporation commission, university of Kansas, Kansas geological survey, 29 Kansas state university, Kansas state university extension system and local conservation districts shall provide assistance and support to each board as 30 31 is reasonably necessary for the achievement of the goals set forth in this 32 section. The Kansas water authority shall consider the efforts of such 33 agencies to assist the districts when recommending appropriations of 34 the state water plan fund.

35 (f)(e) <u>Beginning on January 15, 2025, the board of each district shall</u> 36 submit an annual written report to the house of representatives standing 37 committee on water, the house of representatives standing committee on-38 agriculture and natural resources and the senate standing committee on-39 agriculture and natural resources, and any other appropriate committees, 40 and any successor committees, summarizing any activities undertaken 41 pursuant to this section in the previous calendar year. A representative of 42 the board shall appear before the committee upon request. 43 (g)(f) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to article 10 of
