1	AN ACT concerning the legislature; relating to compensation, salary and
2	retirement benefits of members thereof; creating the legislative
3	compensation commission; prescribing powers and duties of the
4	commission; authorizing the commission to set rates of compensation
5	and salary for members of the legislature; establishing procedures for
6	review and possible rejection of such rates of compensation and salary
7	by the legislature; eliminating the previously established compensation
8	commission; repealing K.S.A. 46-3101.
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10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
11	Section 1. (a) There is created the legislative compensation
12	commission consisting of nine members as follows:
13	(1) One member appointed by the speaker of the house of
14	representatives. Such member appointed by the speaker shall be a former
15	member of the legislature;
16	(2) one member appointed by the president of the senate. Such
17	member appointed by the president shall be a former member of the
18	legislature;
19	(3) one member appointed by the speaker pro tempore of the house of
20	representatives;
21	(4) one member appointed by the vice president of the senate;
22	(5) one member appointed by the majority leader of the house of
23	representatives;
24	(6) one member appointed by the majority leader of the senate;
25	(7) one member appointed by the minority leader of the house of
26	representatives;
27	(8) one member appointed by the minority leader of the senate; and
28	(9) one member appointed by the governor.
29	(b) The initial member appointed by the speaker shall be appointed
30	prior to August 1, 2023. All other initial members shall be appointed prior
31	to September 1, 2023.
32	(c) No person shall be appointed to the commission who is a current
33	member of the legislature, a current employee of the legislature or a
34	registered lobbyist.
35	(d) The member appointed by the speaker shall serve as the first
36	chairperson of the commission. The member appointed by the president

1 shall serve as the first vice chairperson of the commission. Thereafter, the 2 next chairperson to be appointed prior to August 1, 2026, shall be 3 appointed by the president and the next vice chairperson to be appointed 4 prior to September 1, 2026, shall be appointed by the speaker. The 5 authority to appoint the chairperson and vice chairperson for future 6 commissions shall alternate between the speaker and the president in 7 similar manner as for the original appointments. Vacancies shall be filled 8 in the same manner as for the original appointments.

9 (e) Any member of the commission shall be eligible for 10 reappointment.

(f) The term of each appointment to the commission shall end upon
 the completion of the responsibilities of the commission pursuant to
 subsections (h) and (i).

(g) The commission shall meet upon call of the chairperson. A
majority of the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum for
the transaction of any business of the commission. Any action taken by the
commission shall be by majority vote of the members present.

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(h) The legislative compensation commission shall:

19 (1) Make a comprehensive study of the compensation, salary and20 retirement benefits of the members of the legislature;

(2) set the rates of compensation and salary for members of the
 legislature to be effective as provided in subsection (i); and

(3) make recommendations related to retirement benefits for membersof the legislature.

25 (i) In 2023, the legislative compensation commission shall establish the rate of compensation and salary for services rendered by members of 26 27 the legislature during the four-year period that commences on the first day 28 of the term of office that commences on the first day of the legislative session in January of 2025. Such rate of compensation and salary 29 30 established by the commission shall be submitted to the legislature on or 31 before December 1, 2023. Such rate of compensation and salary established by the commission shall be the rate of compensation and salary 32 33 for members of the legislature unless, prior to 30 days after the 34 commencement of the legislative session next occurring after submission 35 of such established rate of compensation and salary to the legislature, the 36 legislature rejects such rate of compensation and salary by the adoption of 37 a concurrent resolution. In the concurrent resolution that rejects such rate 38 of compensation and salary, the legislature may include a requirement that 39 the legislative compensation commission meet within 14 days after the 40 adoption of the concurrent resolution by the legislature to set another rate 41 of compensation and salary to be submitted to the legislature prior to 30 42 days after such adoption of the concurrent resolution. The legislature may 43 reject such rate of compensation and salary by the adoption of a concurrent

resolution prior to adjournment sine die of that legislative session. In the
 event of rejection by the legislature of the second rate of compensation and
 salary set by the commission, the rate of compensation and salary
 prevailing at the time of the previous session shall remain in effect.

5 (j) (1) New members of the commission shall be appointed in 2026 6 and every four years thereafter. The member designated as chairperson of 7 the commission pursuant to subsection (d) shall be appointed prior to 8 August 1 of such year. All other members of the commission shall be 9 appointed prior to September 1 of such year.

(2) Commissions appointed in 2026 and thereafter may meet on call 10 of the chairperson during the calendar year when appointed or the 11 following calendar year. The commission shall set the rate of 12 compensation and salary for members of the legislature to be effective 13 14 during the four-year period that commences on the first day of the next 15 commencing term of office of elected senators. The commission shall 16 submit such rate of compensation and salary to the legislature on or before 17 December 1 of the calendar year following the commission's appointment.

(3) The legislature may take such actions as provided in subsection (i)
 during the legislative session next occurring after the submission of such
 rate of compensation and salary as provided in paragraph (2).

(k) Members of the commission shall receive compensation,
 subsistence allowances, mileage and expenses as provided in K.S.A. 75 3223, and amendments thereto, when attending meetings of the
 commission.

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Sec. 2. K.S.A. 46-3101 is hereby repealed.
