AN ACT concerning education; relating to instruction; requiring critical thinking to be integrated into elementary and secondary instruction.

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WHEREAS, Critical thinking is a powerful tool that enables students to be aware of and sensitive to internal illusions and external deceptions; and

WHEREAS, Critical thinking has two important components: (1) Information processing skills; and (2) the habit of continually using those skills to positively influence perspectives and actions; and

WHEREAS, Critical thinking relies on facts and should be applied when viewing media, in conversation, in employment, engaging in civic responsibilities and choosing friends and other social contacts; and

WHEREAS, Proper critical thinking can lead to improved decision-making, better self-management and more interpersonal awareness; and

WHEREAS, Once instilled, critical thinking is a life-long endeavor that can become a skill that is instinctive, pervasive, empowering and enjoyable.

Now, therefore:

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

- Section 1. (a) As used in this section, "critical thinking" means the intellectually disciplined process of skillfully synthesizing, conceptualizing and evaluating information as a guide to belief and behavior.
- (b) Critical thinking shall be integrated into instruction of all subject areas for students in kindergarten and grades one through 12, including academic and social and emotional learning applications.
 - (c) The state board of education shall:
- (1) Develop and maintain a list of recommended critical thinking educational instruction materials;
- (2) develop standards and resources for school districts to utilize in integrating critical thinking into each school district's curriculum and instruction;
- 32 (3) provide professional development materials and teacher training resources on critical thinking instruction; and
 - (4) periodically review and update critical thinking materials, resources and strategies as necessary.
 - (d) Any critical thinking educational instruction materials developed,

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 provided or maintained by the state board shall be age-appropriate for the grade level such instruction is to be utilized, be clear and consistent, reflect up-to-date research and include interactive or participatory learning experiences.

- (e) Each board of education of a school district shall:
- (1) Integrate critical thinking instruction into all subject areas for students in kindergarten and grades one through 12;
 - (2) evaluate critical thinking resources and tools periodically; and
- (3) use critical thinking educational instruction materials developed by such school district or from the list maintained by the state board.
- (f) The state department of education shall annually provide a report to the house of representatives standing committee on education and the senate standing committee on education or any successor committees on the implementation of critical thinking instruction in school districts.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
